


Hillcrest Caddie Supporters,

I am proud to announce that Hillcrest Country Club caddie, Ben Fencl, has been named as a finalist for the Evans Scholarship! One of our best caddies, Ben is a senior at North Central High School and has worked over 100 loops in his three summers caddying at Hillcrest. Ben's success means this is the 4th consecutive year Hillcrest has had a finalist!



This year, there are 16 finalists from across the state of Indiana who will participate in their final interview at the **Indiana Evans Scholar Selection Meeting which will take place via Zoom call this year next Thursday, January 28th.** These high school seniors will be vying for the Chick Evans Caddie Scholarship, a four-year, full-tuition scholarship to either Indiana University or Purdue University awarded to those young men and women who have:

- Outstanding academic records
- Outstanding character
- Worked as a golf caddie
- Financial need

In this final stage of the application process, the finalists will field questions over a Zoom call (in a normal year, it is in person behind a podium) in a press-conference-style setting from attendees who are donors of the program and country club members from around the state. Have tissues nearby—some of their stories are jaw-dropping!
